


LET'S LEARN ABOUT NATURE STEWARDSHIP



NATURE STEWARDSHIP

BIODIVERSITY

Remember that the natural space you are learning in is the home of different plants and animals. Known as biodiversity. Let's help keep these homes safe.

THINK ABOUT WHAT YOU NEED

Remember we share nature with other living things. Let's think about what we need for our project. Consider using twigs, fallen leaves or rocks (and other non-living things). Take a look and find other things you can use that are already on the ground. We never take everything. This is called conservation.
